# The Competence Matrix



The PAL LAB Competence Matrix aims at the development of teachers' skills and competences in order to fight against and eliminate early school leaving by Romani students.

Partners worked together to analyse and process their findings from all previous activities and draw results on the necessary skills and competences for teachers that work with Romani children.

Romani children have unique learning needs and preferences and educators must be provided with strategies to adapt their teaching methods in order to better meet the Romani students' needs.

This may include incorporating culturally relevant materials and utilizing interactive and experiential learning approaches!










The Competency Framework represents a set of guidelines and standards that outline the knowledge, skills, attitudes and behaviours required for effective teaching and engagement with Romani students. This framework is designed to help teachers understand the specific needs, backgrounds, and experiences of Romani children and to equip them with the tools necessary to support their academic. social. and



emotional development in order to eventually prevent early school leaving. The skills are categorized into four main Competencies including Interpersonal Skills, Inter-cultural Skills, Digital Skills and Pedagogy Skills. Moreover, the skills are labeled as top priority, medium and low priority, depending on their importance.

Setting out the necessary skills for teachers, gives the partners the essential tools for the successful elaboration of the teachers' curriculum entitled "Pedagogy Toolbox for teachers and mediators".

The curriculum aims to set a basis for comparable and high-quality education for teachers of Romani in order to initiate primarily a qualitative (as well as quantitative) change in Romani teaching and,

inter alia, to improve the quality of education and the educational situation of Romani children by raising respect for the teachers and lessons.






# Learning Teaching Training Activity in Ankara
