THEORY OF CHANGE PROJECT: TRAINING AND INCLUSION STRATEGIES FOR PROJECT PARTNERS IN MILAN

#### News

The Exchange Visit and Training in Milan, held in the first week of February, served as a pivotal moment for the Theory of Change (TOC) project, with Dr. Stefanos Spaneas, Executive Director of CODECA, and Ms. Marina Andreou, Project Manager of the TOC Project, actively engaging in critical discussions. These discussions, ranging from Steering Committee meetings to detailed project updates, provided an essential foundation for introducing two key tools: the Toolkit and the Game Bank.

The focus of the training was not just on the theoretical aspects of these resources but on their practical applications in enhancing education and fostering inclusion. The team participated in hands-on training that allowed them to deeply explore the ways these tools can be adapted to diverse educational contexts, enabling better engagement and learning outcomes. A key session delved into the potential of the Toolkit and Game Bank to promote inclusive education, equipping participants with the knowledge to customize and utilize them effectively.


As part of the Exchange Visit, the team worked on targeted sessions that aimed to develop strategies for adapting the Toolkit to different contexts, ensuring its flexibility for various settings and needs. This was coupled with another session focused on designing effective engagement and training strategies, ensuring that the tools would be used to their fullest potential in real-world scenarios.

Additionally, monitoring and evaluation (M&E) considerations were discussed extensively to ensure that the progress of the TOC project could be properly tracked and assessed. This will be essential as the project moves forward and future training initiatives are rolled out. As the Exchange Visit came to a close, the team took time to reflect on the key takeaways from the sessions, recognizing how the insights gained would influence both the immediate next steps of the project and its long-term goals.

This exchange represents a significant moment in the Theory of Change project, bridging theory with practice, and laying the groundwork for future success in achieving the project's objectives of fostering education and inclusion.

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

Eighty-four percent of the world's population belong to a religion a percentage that is rising all the time (Deutschland, 2019). What this statistic show us is that religion plays a significant role in the daily lives of European citizens; but religion can also be a source of conflict between religious groups, and not enough is being done on a national level in our countries to encourage dialogue between these faith groups and cultures, to raise awareness of our shared values and to create a peaceful co-existence between cultural and religious groups across Europe. European citizens are taught to celebrate the diversity within our society. Through practicing tolerance and acceptance of others, Europe should be a land for cultural, religious, and political freedom for all its citizens. The main aim of the CO-EXIST project is to help young people engage in citizen journalism, counter the narratives of other religions presented in mainstream media, and harness the potential of social media platforms to promote cultural and religious tolerance across Europe. To achieve these goals, the partnership has created the following educational resources:

- A citizen media curriculum to develop youth skills
- On-the-job training for front-line youth workers that was piloted during a three-day training course organized for youth workers in Kalamata, Greece.
- CO-EXIST online quests for interfaith dialogue and digital newsroom All these resources were presented and tested during pilots organized by each partner. The CATAPULT (Catapult Your Career - Career Guidance and Key Competences for Youth) project develops an innovative career guidance program to support young people, especially those from disadvantaged backgrounds. It provides tools and resources to improve their employability in digital and knowledge-based industries.

With an Al-powered chatbot mentor and digital training modules, young people will build essential career skills like planning, time management, and self-discipline, boosting their employment prospects.

#### **ACTIVITIES WE WILL IMPLEMENT:**

- \*Researching hidden barriers to youth employment and vocational training, leading to a policy recommendation report.
- \*Creating a Career Profiling and Planning Tool with accessible career pathways.
- \*Developing an Al-powered digital training platform with short video lessons and interactive tasks.
- \*Piloting project tools in schools and training 150 teachers for student guidance.
- \*Disseminating results to advance guidance career approaches for youth.

This project introduces an innovative model to improve young people's access to quality employment across Europe.

**ROMNIME:** TWO YEARS OF PROJECT SUPPORTING YOUNG ROMA GIRLS. MENTORING AND PROFESSIONAL OPPORTUNITIES THROUGH THE ROLE OF INFLUENCER

This new and ambitious two-year project was launched with the aim of supporting young Roma girls in the professional and social challenges they face every day, providing them with the tools and resources needed to develop their potential and create a support network through mentoring. The project, promoted by Diakonissalaitos, is implemented in collaboration with strategic partners from Finland, Italy, Bulgaria, and Croatia, with the involvement of local and international experts in mentoring, social inclusion, and women's empowerment.

Italy has decided to focus on new professions, both to increase the interest of young people in the project and to broaden the target audience. For this reason, activities have been initiated to teach these girls how to leverage the role of influencer to support the Roma community and, above all, how to turn this activity into a structured job, connecting them with mentors who can guide them in their professional and life paths.

The project, with its innovative mentoring approach, offers young Roma women and girls new opportunities in the workforce and society, supporting them step by step.

This mentoring method is one of the key components of the project: the effects and results will be shared with a wide audience, so that the project supports not only the individual but can create a replicable model of female empowerment that can have an international impact.

Plan International España is currently implementing the "CODIZATE CON PLAN" project (2023-PRTR-CODI-CODIZATE CON PLAN), financed by the Spanish Digital Competences for Children Programme - CODI, implemented by the Spanish Ministry of Youth and Childhood and funded by the European Union - Next Generation EU. This project which aims to reduce the digital gap by providing girls, boys and teen agers (10-13 and 14-17 years old) from 5 Spanish Autonomous Communities with training in basic digital skills. As well, advanced digital skills are also provided to teen agers, promoting training for employability with a gender perspective.

In particular, the type of courses provided are the following:

- •Basic digital skills for participants aged 9-11, to strengthen their school learning and prepare them to access and manage in the digital environment safely.
- •Digital competences for participants aged 12-13 on privacy on social media and prevention of cyberbullying.
- •Advanced skills for participants aged 14-17 focused on improving their employability with a gender perspective, offering them the necessary tools to successfully face the challenges of the labour market.
